AVA provides information about research and best practices in a quarterly journal, advocates for the profession of volunteer resources management, offers networking opportunities and high quality training at an annual international conference, supports local networks of volunteer management professionals and recognizes excellence in the field through a credentialing program and an annual awards program.

Earn the international mark of Excellence!

AVA offers a professional credentialing program for individuals who manage volunteer resources. Newly revised, the program follows the model used for credentialing in other professions. Those who earn the credential are entitled to use "CVA" after their names – a distinction that demonstrates their competence and skills as volunteer administrators.

The first step in the process is to request a free "Certified in Volunteer Administration Candidate Handbook," which covers all the details of the process and includes a registration form. AVA members receive a discount on the registration fee.

The credentialing program has two parts:

- A multiple choice exam offered two times per year
- A portfolio consisting of a Philosophy Statement and Management Narrative

Candidates have two years to complete the program.
